This spring a team from Village Bible Church visited our family and The Kable Shepherd Center. They represented several sponsors of TKSC boys, and visited them on their behalf. The team also spared luggage for many of our sponsors from all over the USA to send letters and pack-

ages. We also had some time for a team member to share his testimony (which the boys could really relate to), as well as singing and play games together.

It was a good time for our friends and supporters to get a glimpse of the work we are involved in with former street children. Our family enjoyed hosting the team for lunch and fellowship at our home as well.

Over the past few months TKSC has observed an increased number of younger boys on the streets. So our monthly outreaches have been a bit more focused on them. This year we have already enrolled some of these boys in order to take them out of their current situations and set them on a trajectory for a new life. We

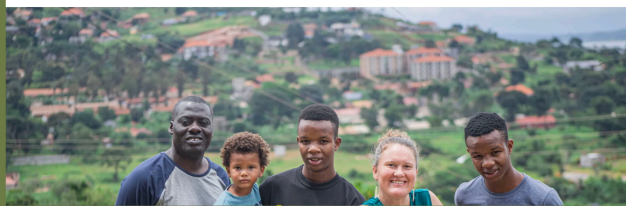
are excited to see how they progress now that they are back in school and gaining hope for their future.

Around that same time we remembered what would have been Moriah's second birthday. We honored her life by visiting the NICU in our local hospital. During our visit, they were caring for five babies. We were able to meet with the mamas, share our story, and pray with them. We left the hospital staff with some gift packages to bless the families, which included baby baths, diapers, shea butter, natural soap, towels, muslin blankets, and clothes. It is our hope that some practical things like those brought some small relief amidst unexpected and challenging times with their infants in the hospital.

We were quite proud of them.

An even bigger accomplishment with the twins was achieved this year. After more paperwork, meetings, fees, and a trip to Kampala, we have finalized Simon and Solomon's dual citizenship. After years of processes and documentation, they are now finished with all major legal work and can freely function as Ugandan and US citizens. Being an international family is not simple, to be sure, so this is a huge milestone and relief for us.

Micah continues to love school. He is excited about all he is learning with letters and numbers. Probably the most exciting thing he likes to report on is the new country he learns about each week. Micah is known to regularly

ask in what country something is happening. He also loves to play soccer at school with the "big" kids, basketball in the garage with his brothers, and baseball in the yard with mom or dad.

With Patrick, we are still waiting, hoping, and praying that the ban on his visa process will be lifted by the USA government. Until this changes, we cannot pursue our hope of us all being able to travel to the USA and him meeting friends and family there, and more.

For quite some time, Lisa has been working on the possibility of having books published. She is currently working on some children's books. This year she has been able to find an artist to work with, and has recently begun conversations with a potential local publisher. Eventually she hopes to also pursue writing & self-publishing books for adults about her life and experiences.
